This job is part of a team who collects and archives information about river flow, groundwater, rainfall, water quality and air quality to support programmes across Council and the wider community.

It offers a mix of field and office work. The team uses a variety of electronic equipment and data loggers to collect information so having an aptitude for maths and physics is a must, as well as being a strong swimmer.

TRANSPORTATION ENGINEER

Entry level: \$75,000 – \$85,000 Competent: \$100,000 – \$120,000

This job is part of a team that ensures our roads are safe and efficient, getting people from A to B, preparing technical documentation around speed limits, traffic controls and other road matters like the Tasman Great Taste Cycle Trail.

It offers a mix of field and office work that includes planning, design, operation, construction and maintenance of the District's transportation network.

RIVERS AND COASTAL ENGINEER

Entry level: \$75,000 – \$85,000 Competent: \$100,000 – \$120,000

This job is a specialist role that is tasked with the management of the Council's river and coastal assets, gravel extraction and protecting the community from river and coastal damage.

It offers a mix of field and office work that includes managing and implementing renewal and capital projects for river and coastal assets.

UTILITIES ENGINEER

Entry level: \$75,000 – \$85,000 Competent: \$90,000 – \$110,000

This job is part of a team who deliver waste management, stormwater, wastewater and water supply service across the Council's district water assets.

It offers a mix of field and office work such as water reticulation management, network modelling, leak detection and backflow prevention, waste management and minimisation, monitoring hazardous waste and agricultural chemicals.

PROJECT MANAGER (CIVIL)

Entry level: \$75,000 – \$85,000 Competent: \$100,000 – \$120,000

This job is part of a team who oversee the project management of the design, construction, monitoring, risk management and hand-over of infrastructure projects such as new drinking water treatment plants, wastewater treatment plant upgrades, new bridges and high street upgrades.

It offers a mix of field and office work connected to managing a full project management lifecycle service including writing business case briefs, awarding contracts and monitoring the project's progress.

LIBRARIAN

Entry level: \$65,000 - \$70,000 Competent: \$70,000 - \$80,000

This job is part of a team who help people find information in many formats, including printed and electronic resources, audio and video recordings, photographs, information databases and web-based and digital resources.

The role of a Librarian is continually evolving to meet social and technical needs. They also help people with information literacy support, device (e-readers, tablets) support, organise events and assist community groups to host events in the library space.

IT SERVICE DESK OPERATOR

Entry level: \$55,000 – \$60,000 Competent: \$60,000 – \$70,000

This job is part of the Information Services team, and is the first point of contact for all internal IT queries.

This is an office based job and the work includes routine computer hardware and software administration tasks, providing an excellent service desk service to minimise downtime and maximise staff productivity in their use of Council information systems.

CONSENT PLANNER

Entry level: \$75,000 - \$85,000 Competent: \$95,000 - \$110,000

This job is part of a team who provide advice and assistance around the resource consents process including resource consents processing, post-approval onsite inspections, attending hearings, processes LIM reports and property information requests.

This is a mostly office based job and our Resource Consent team receives and processes well over 1,000 resource consents each year.

POLICY PLANNER

Entry level: \$75,000 – \$85,000 Competent: \$95,000 – \$110,000

This job is part of a team who develop, analyse and monitor policies for a range of environmental planning activities and writing draft changes to the Tasman Resource Management Plan.

This is a mostly office based job and there are a number of portfolios spanning natural resources, urban and rural development, land and coastal management.

CUSTOMER SERVICES OFFICER

Entry level: \$57,000 - \$60,000 Competent: \$60,000 - \$65,000

This job is part of a team who are the first point of contact for customers and supports them by providing helpful information, answering questions, taking payments and making sure the customer's query is recorded and passed on to the right person to resolve.

This is an office based job and involves working with office technologies, using telephone and service request system and a cash register.

NZ Diploma in Business (Administration and Technology) – with Level 3. 4 and 5

ADMINISTRATION OFFICER

Entry level: \$57,000 – \$60,000 Competent: \$60,000 – \$65,000

This job is part of a team that completes administrative tasks like answering telephone calls, scheduling meetings, providing administrative support to their department, preparing reports and scanning documents. They may also be responsible for processing invoicing and payments, and providing customer service.

This is an office based job and involves working with a large range of office technologies.

ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENTIST

Entry level: \$75,000 – \$85,000 Competent: \$95,000 – \$110,000

This job is part of a team that use their knowledge of the natural sciences to protect the environment and human health. They provide advice to elected members, policymakers, and also work with industry to help them to make environmentally sustainable decisions.

It offers a mix of field and office work that includes testing and sampling, data collection and analysis to shed light on how to prevent or handle environmental hazards or problems.

ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH OFFICER


Entry level: \$70,000 - \$80,000 Competent: \$90,000 - \$100,000

This job is part of a team that protects public health by inspecting businesses for food and alcohol safety, food hygiene standards and other regulated activities like hairdressing, and managing infectious diseases or pests.

It offers a mix of field and office based work. Environmental Health Officers are focused on prevention, consultation, investigation, and education of the community regarding health risks and maintaining a safe environment.

ACCOUNTANT

Entry level: \$75,000 - \$85,000 Competent: \$90,000 - \$110,000

This job is part of a team that prepares cash forecasting and budgeting, tax returns, managing investment portfolios, carrying out internal audits on accounts, and analysing financial performance.

This is an office based job and most Accountants get involved in a wide range of finance-related tasks. Specialised areas include Financial Accountant, Management Accountant, Revenue Accountant and Systems Accountant.

ASSISTANT ACCOUNTANT

Entry level: \$65,000 – \$70,000 Competent: \$70,000 – \$80,000

This job is all about assisting the accountants to prepare cash forecasts and budgets, tax returns, carry out internal audits on accounts, and analyse financial performance.

This is an office based job and most Assistant Accountants get involved in a wide range of finance-related tasks.

HORTICULTURAL OFFICER

Entry level: \$65,000 – \$70,000 Competent: \$70,000 – \$80,000

This job is part of a team who looks after the parks, playgrounds, sports fields and scenic reserves throughout the District. Managing the contractors who carry the physical work involved is also an important part of the job.

If offers a mix of field and office based work. Horticultural Officers design landscape plans, build hard and soft landscaping, manage plant nurseries and help communities with conservation planting and education.

National Certificate in Horticulture (Level 4) / Bachelor of Horticultural Sciences

BUILDING TECHNICAL OFFICER

Entry level: \$65,000 – \$75,000 Competent: \$85,000 – \$95,000

This job is part of a team who are responsible for making sure that buildings (residential and commercial) comply with the Building Act by reviewing plans, providing advice and carrying out onsite inspections.

There are two main parts to this job – processing building consents and inspecting the building work. A processing job is office based and an inspecting job is a mix of mostly field based with some office work.

IT NETWORK ENGINEER

Entry level: \$75,000 – \$80,000 Competent: \$90,000 – \$110,000

This job is part of a team who look after enterprise-wide networks and systems including software, hardware and applications. They maintain firewalls, manage security, install equipment, perform upgrades and find ways to improve network performance.

This is an office based job and many Network Engineers choose to specialise in certain areas of information technology delivery.

STUDY OPTIONS

Bachelor of Information Technology / Bachelor of Information Sciences (IT)

BUSINESS ANALYST

Entry level: \$70,000 – \$85,000 Competent: \$90,000 – \$100,000

This job is part of a team who use both business and information technology tools to evaluate the Council's operating systems, procedures and design improvements. They typically consult with managers or other staff to understand how they use IT systems, analyse costs and benefit of new systems, implement new systems and train the system's users.

This is an office based job and most Business Analysts tend to specialise in certain systems such as financial or engineering.

BUSINESS PARTNER PEOPLE AND WELLBEING

Entry level: \$70,000 - \$80,000 Competent: \$85,000 - \$100,000

This job is part of a team responsible for providing advice and assistance to managers and staff in the areas of recruitment and selection, wellbeing performance management and remuneration, disciplinary processes, learning and development, organisation restructuring, employment relations and policy development.

This is an office based job and some people specialise in specific portfolios such as recruitment or learning and development.

Bachelor of Business (Human Resource Management) / Bachelor of Science or Arts (Psychology)

COMMUNICATIONS OFFICER

Entry level: \$60,000 – \$70,000 Competent: \$70,000 – \$85,000

This job is part of a team who are responsible for creating communications and media content for print and online use. They do everything from writing press releases to developing blog content and creating social media posts.

The job offers a mix of mostly office and some field work and strong writing and communication skills are really important.

SUMMER STUDENT

First year: minimum wage + \$0.50 Second year: minimum wage + \$1.00

Every year we have summer student work in areas of environmental policy, resource consents, science and environmental information, and engineering. The criteria to apply is:

- be available to work throughout the entire employment period
- be physically fit and have a current full drivers licence (preferably for a manual vehicle)

· have completed at least one year of tertiary study

 be studying for a qualification relevant to Council work such as environmental science, environmental policy, planning, applied sciences or engineering, and

• be from the Nelson Tasman region.


